What are we doing to continue our improvement?

- Primary focus on addressing academic achievement of all students
 - O Continue to incorporate interim assessment blocks (IABs) at all levels as formative assessments to help inform instruction
 - O Review of student data, both cohort and individual, to address concerns immediately and formally (through Multi-Tiered Systems of Support process)
- Curriculum resource enhancements, adjustments and professional learning in areas of reading and math (Illustrative Math, K-3 science of reading, IAB use at CLES and BHS, etc)
- Monitor attendance at all levels and address concerns through outreach and within statutory requirements
- Communicate from building and district level regarding importance of participation in state testing
- Implementation of District Strategic Plan of Action
