Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope you have had a restful summer and are excited for the upcoming year.

Last spring I had the privilege of meeting individually with the majority of teachers in our district. Reflecting upon these meetings with faculty; three themes emerged: first, meeting with the faculty affirmed my belief that we have a tremendously caring, dedicated and talented team in Brookfield; next, the majority expressed a commitment to support the Strategic Coherence Plan, and; finally, I heard a clear message regarding universal concern for our students emotional health and a need to support the development of their regulation and coping skills from Pre-K-12.

In response to the concern regarding students' emotional health, a team consisting of Whisconier's Principal, Mr. Renda, Assistant Superintendent, Dr. Ruby, Director of Pupil Personnel Services, Dr. Sipala, and I attended a three-day training at the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence. Participants included districts from across the country, including our neighboring superintendents and their leadership teams from New Canaan, Westport and Ridgefield. The theme of the training was *Emotions Matter*. To support students, it is critical that adults are able to recognize, understand, label and then proactively respond to their personal feelings. Educators must first develop their own emotional intelligence before they can support students to do the same. Our plan will begin with priming all administrators this summer with the foundational cornerstones of Yale's approach to developing emotional intelligence. Furthermore, Yale will collaborate with the faculty and staff at Whisconier this year as part of Brookfield's launch. In fact, Dr. Marc Brackett of the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence, will be joining the faculty and staff to deliver the keynote convocation address when teachers return from summer recess.
