<u>Math</u>

We are learning all about decimals & measurement! In these units students will:

- Work with decimal place value
- Explore decimals and fractions
- Add, compare, & order decimals
- Convert between centimeters and meters
- Convert between meters and kilometers
- Solve problems involving elapsed time
- Tell time to the nearest hour and minute
- Convert inches to feet

<u>Reading</u>

We are beginning our Historical Fiction unit! During this unit, students will:

- work collaboratively in book clubs
- identify elements of the historical fiction genre
- analyze historical events and how they are portrayed in fiction pieces
- grow ideas about their reading

<u>Writing:</u>

During this unit, we are focusing on writing literary essays. Students will:

- grow ideas about their historical fiction texts
- identify themes in their texts
- develop thesis statements using the ideas they have grown about their texts
- plan and write literary essays
