Concept and Roles in Student Personnel

The focus of the school system is on the learner, the student. The student's educational development toward the school's goals is the central concern of the board of education's policies and the administrator's regulations.

Each child of each parent shall be given equal opportunity. But since children vary widely in capacities, interests, social and economic background, no two can be treated exactly alike if the fullest development of each is to be achieved.

The board of education will attempt to erase limitations of facilities and means that stand in the way of our school's availability to all who wish to learn in this school system.

Discrimination among students applying for admission to or attending our schools with respect to race, color, religious creed, age, marital status, national origin, sex or physical disability is prohibited.
