Community Relations - Students

Honoring Student Achievement

Periodically the Board of Education will recognize student achievement in academic and/or co-curricular accomplishments. Accordingly, each building principal will submit to the Superintendent the names of individual or groups of students whose extraordinary achievements deserve recognition.

The following are examples of such exemplary achievements:

- any individual or team whose performance record, academic or athletic, results in wide recognition;
- selected National Merit Scholars;
- new inductees to the National Honor Society;
- names of students receiving the highest academic honors each marking period, or demonstrate significant improvement, as appropriate, by building;
- the contribution of unusual service to the school and/or community by a student;
- meritorious service by a student;
- students who earn or achieve an unusually exemplary status, i.e. Eagle Scout, invitation to perform with a nationally known group such as the Boston Philharmonic Orchestra;
- the top ten graduating high school seniors.

The principal or his designee should establish a building-wide committee to oversee the process and make recommendations to the principal. Monetary awards, college selections, etc. are not appropriate for recommendation. Names of individuals or teams should be submitted on a standardized form.
