National Honor Society

Brookfield High School may maintain a National Honor Society affiliate. The handbook of the National Honor Society shall be used as a general procedural guide.

Eleventh and first semester twelfth grade students are eligible for membership. The four criteria used for judging membership are:

- 1) scholarship
- 2) service to the school or community
- 3) character
- 4) leadership qualities

Eligible students must have a 3.5 average in courses taken for credit to be considered for membership.

Grades in all subjects including special subjects such as physical education, art, music, technical arts, and home arts shall be used in computing the scholastic average. Grades that have been accepted from another accredited school should also be included in computing the average.

In the eleventh grade, the final ninth and tenth grade, and first semester eleventh grade work shall be considered.

In the twelfth grade, the final ninth, tenth and eleventh, and first semester twelfth grade work shall be considered.

A representative faculty council appointed by the building administrator, and consisting of five members, shall make the final selection of students for honor society membership. Duration of faculty council membership shall be for a period of two years with two members and then three members appointed on alternating years. Consecutive terms are not permitted.

Honor society members who are in jeopardy of losing their membership because of a serious deficiency in one or more of the membership criteria, may be placed on a probationary status or dismissed from membership after a full review by the faculty council. A majority vote of the faculty council shall determine a student's admission to, probationary status in, or dismissal from an honor society.
