Participation by the Public

The Brookfield Board of Education recognizes that the public has expertise useful to the schools. The Board encourages the involvement of citizens to act as advisors and resource people. Advisory groups should be broadly representative, their recommendations should be based on research facts, insights and understandings and submitted to the Board which alone has the authority and responsibility to act on them.

Areas where citizens are encouraged to become involved:

1. In the development of policy statements.
2. In those instances where the specific talents of the lay person or persons complement and extend the instructional services of the classroom teacher.
3. In solving specific problems.
4. In serving as advisory people to curriculum development projects.
5. As members of a School Improvement Planning or Design Teams.
