Community Relations

Visits to the Schools

- 1. The building administrator shall require all visitors to register at the office and sign the visitors' log.
- 2. Any parent wishing to visit a school which his or her child attends, may do so at any time during school hours. A parent who wishes to visit a student's class while it is in session, may do so with prior notification of the building principal. If a class will be involved in an activity, the nature of which is such that his/her presence would be inherently disruptive, the building administrator shall advise the parent of the problem and arrange an alternate visitation.
- 3. An other adult wishing to visit a classroom or classrooms, may do so at anytime during school hours with prior notification of the building principal. If a class will be involved in an activity, the nature of which is such that the adult's presence would be inherently disruptive, the building administrator shall advise the visitor of the problem and arrange an alternate visitation.
- 4. A visitor must not interrupt a class in any way, nor speak to or disturb the students. If the visitor desires to discuss his/her observation with the teacher, he/she must make arrangements for a later conference or contact the teacher at a later time for an appointment.
- 5. The administrator shall have complete authority to exclude any persons whom there is reason to believe are disrupting the educational program in the classroom or in the school, are disturbing the teachers or students on the grounds or whom the administrator believes are on the premises for the purpose of committing an illegal act, from the school building and/or grounds.
