

Tutoring

The Board of Education recognizes the need for two types of paid tutors in the schools:

- ~~1. School provided tutors in legally identified situations to give home instruction and specialized instruction to students. These tutors are paid with public funds.~~
- ~~2. Private tutors to offer students, a special type of instruction not available in the regular school program such as individual or small group tutoring at the request of parents.~~

Tutors Employed by the School System

Employment of school provided tutors shall conform with employment policies for professional personnel. These teachers and tutors are to be paid at a uniform rate approved by the Board of Education.

Private Tutors

The Board of Education permits teachers to serve as private tutors and use school premises to give instruction to individual or small groups of students as authorized by the Superintendent as a convenience to parents and students. These arrangements are subject to the following conditions:

- ~~1. The fee charged by the private teacher shall be set by the Board of Education.~~
- ~~2. The Superintendent or designee shall approve the tutors who may use school premises for this purpose. A list of these tutors will be provided by the building administrator, who will make it available to parents at their request.~~
- ~~3. A staff member of the school system may serve as a private tutor; however, he/she may not tutor a student whom he/she has in a class either on school premises or elsewhere for payment by the parents.~~

Tutors Employed by Outside Service Provider

Teachers may also work for an outside service provider. They are subject to the payment structure set by such provider, however, such teacher must not tutor a student whom they have in their class.
