Non-Instructional Operations

Food Service

The school system shall operate a school lunch program in each school under the supervision of the Director of Business and Finance.

The goal of the school lunch program shall be a self-supporting operation providing healthful, reasonably priced food of good quality.

Food services shall include hot lunches as determined by the National School Lunch Program.

The Brookfield Board of Education shall approve annually the prices set for school lunches.

As required for participation in the National School Lunch Program, the Board agrees to the following:

- 1. "Type A" lunch as defined by United Stated Department of Agriculture shall be made available to all students; and
- 2. Free and reduced-price "Type A" lunch shall be provided to students who cannot afford to pay the price for the "Type A" lunch. This determination shall be made in accordance with federal criteria.

Students shall also be permitted to bring their lunches from home and to purchase beverages and incidental items.
