Students receive an advanced, first-hand look at the college experience by taking classes and living on campus. The classroom experience is paired with an active exploration of New York City. Students apply to apply today! Applications will be accepted until April 15, 2019.

The cost of the program is \$3,000 which includes course instruction, reading materials, two meals per day, housing, and events. Upon completion of the program, students will receive a Certificate of Course Completion.

Students who are admitted to Pace University as an undergraduate will receive three general credits toward their degree, as well as a yearly \$3,000 scholarship if a competitive GPA of 3.0 or above is maintained.

American Legion Boys State - A Leadership Program for High School Juniors

As a program of The American Legion, Boys State developed from the concept that youth should be offered a better perspective of the practical operation of government; that the individual is an integral part and commensurately responsible for the character and success of his government. As such, it is an activity of high educational value, born out of a need for youth training in practical citizenship.

Boys State is easily classified as a leadership action program where qualified male high school juniors take part in a practical government course designed to develop in the young citizens a working knowledge of the structure of government and to impress upon them the fact that government is just what they make it.

To qualify to attend Connecticut Boys State, a student must be a **male high school junior**, maintaining a C or better average and a resident of the state of Connecticut. Boys State is a recognized activity of CASSP (Connecticut Association of Secondary School Principals) and time off from scheduled school activities is generally permitted to boys selected to attend the program. The Connecticut American Legion Boys' State Leadership Program will take place from **Saturday**, **June 22 through Thursday**, **June 27**, **2019**. **There is no cost to the delegates**. **If you are interested**, **please see your Counselor**.
