Seniors:

Congratulations on your accomplishments!

Juniors

Draft and revise your college essay.

Many of you started working on this assignment in your English classes, so spend some time reviewing and revising your essay this summer. Make sure that the content of your essay adds something to your application. Think about all of the other information that will be included in your application--GPA, coursework, standardized test scores, extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, etc. What's missing from that picture? What would you like an admissions officer to know about you that doesn't come across in any of that other information? Choose a topic that will give a better and more complete picture of who you are as a person.

Resume Development

This year the counselors worked with you to develop a resume on Naviance that highlighted all of your activities and achievements in high school thus far. Continue to update this document as you continue involvement with extracurriculars and community service, partake in new activities, or earn new accolades.

Freshmen

Extracurricular Involvement & Community Service

On our senior survey, we asked seniors what advice they wished to impart to underclassmen. Many students encouraged underclassmen to get involved in activities outside of the classroom, saying things like "Get involved in an activity that you love" and "Do meaningful volunteer work."



UConn First Summer is an exciting summer opportunity designed for <u>all incoming freshmen</u> and transfer students who will be starting at UConn in the fall. This intensive five-week program was created to give interested admitted students a strong jump start to both their coursework and the <u>UConn</u> experience.*

Are you graduating from high school this spring? UConn First Summer will help with the transition to college by offering a jump start to your academic career. It will also provide you with the opportunity to explore the main campus and surrounding communities and to gain skills for college success.

*This optional program is open to incoming freshmen and transfer students admitted to any of UConn's five campuses. However, this program runs as an independent summer program and does not alter any aspect of your fall admissions status, including your admission campus or any scholarship/financial aid decisions. Financial awards for fall semester do *not* guarantee any financial support for the First Summer program.

It is required that participants be available for the full five weeks of the program for which they are registered. There is a required opening Welcome Reception and full program meeting Sunday, July 14th.
