College And Career Corner

November 15 is Fee - Free Application Day

This is the second year in which the Connecticut State Colleges & Universities system have offered "Fee-Free Application Day".

Any Connecticut high school students who submit their applications to UConn and CT State Colleges on Nov. 15 will be able to waive the undergraduate application fee.

The waiver is intended to increase access to students whose financial constraints could make the fee difficult to pay, and who otherwise might hesitate to apply. The Nov. 15 Fee-Free Application Day applies to high school students from Connecticut at any income levels who submit their materials that day through the Common Application.



TIMELINE FOR APPLYING TO COLLEGE

(Excerpt from Detailed Guide below)

NOV.	→ 1st/15th → Common dead line for many Early Action/Early Decision applications. Check with each individual college to determine its deadlines.
	>> 3rd → Registration Deadline for December SAT
	> 5th → SAT Test Date
	 Continue working on applications and all supplemental materials, including essays and resume.
	Continue applying to schools of interest, and request transcripts 10 school days prior to the deadline.
	Request that 1st quarter grades be sent to the colleges that require them using the survey link emailed by the Counseling Department.
DEC.	> 1st → Priority deadline for University of Connecticut.
	> 1st/15th → Common dead line for many Early Action/Early Decision applications. Check with each individual college to determine its deadlines.
	➤ 3rd → SAT Test Date
	➤ 10th → ACT Test Date
	 Finish applying to schools of interest, and remember to request transcripts in time.
	Make sure to submit applications on time, and be aware of earlier deadlines for competitive majors, scholarship eligibility, and honors programs.

Note: In either instance, if you haven't already done so, you'll be asked to set up a free College Board account before you can view your scores.
