WHY ATTEND?

- 30 minutes in length
- Usually held in the Counseling Office Conference Room
- Usually small group of students + counselor
- Sometimes reps have a speech prepared; sometimes more informal Q & A

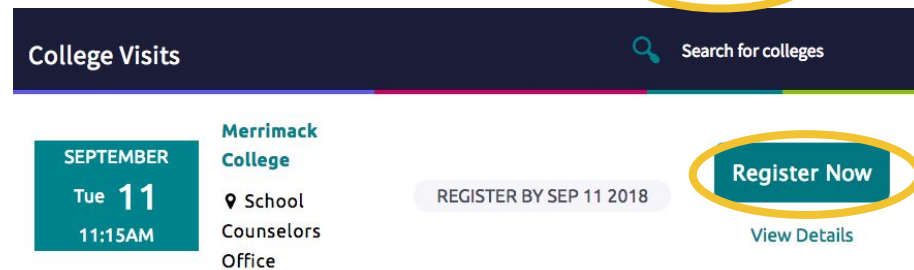
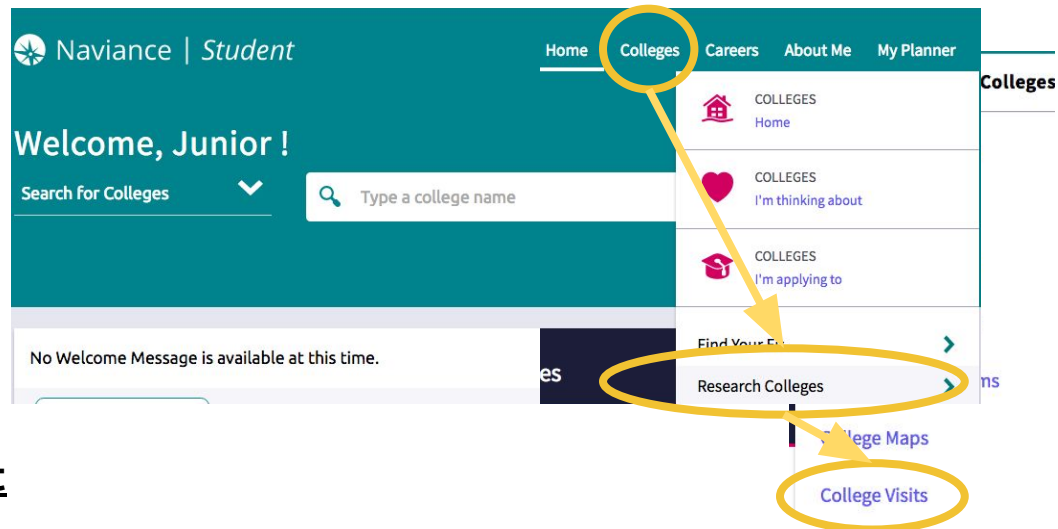
SIGNING UP FOR A VISIT

1. Sign in at naviance.com with your BHS email and password. Use the “Forgot your password?” tool if necessary. (Don’t keep guessing or you’ll be Locked out.)

2. View the list of colleges by going to Colleges → Research Colleges → College Visits.


3. If a college visit falls during a flex, lunch, or study hall, you may attend. **If it falls during class, you must get permission from the teacher.**

4. Register for the visit in Naviance, and **put a reminder in your phone or calendar.**



WHAT IF I CAN'T ATTEND OR I'M ABSENT?

1. Complete a “Request for Information” card in the Counseling Office ahead of time, and give it to Mrs. Hopcroft to give to the admissions counselor.
2. Check Naviance (Overview → Counselor Comments) after the visit for updated information, including the admission counselor’s name and contact information and the latest admissions data. Consider emailing the admissions counselor to convey your interest in the college.

ON THE DAY OF THE VISIT

1. If coming from **study hall or class**, check-in with the teacher and **get a pass** to the Counseling Office. If coming from flex or lunch, go straight to the Counseling Office.
2. **Check-in with Mrs. Hopcroft** once you get to the Counseling Office. Wait until Mrs. Hopcroft or a counselor directs you to the Conference Room.
3. Often the rep will have you **complete an inquiry card** with basic information. These are a way to demonstrate interest in the college, so we encourage you to complete them.
4. Before you leave, see Mrs. Hopcroft to **sign a thank you card** to the representative.

Keep in mind how you are presenting yourself to the college representative.

These people are often the first (and sometimes only) readers for applications from BHS students.

We encourage you to...

*introduce yourself

*shake hands

*make eye contact

*ask questions

*thank them for coming

Also, avoid wearing clothing/hats of another college on the day of the visit.
