Public Participation

The Board of Education encourages all citizens to attend its regular meetings, special meetings and standing committee meetings so they may become better acquainted with the operation and programs of the schools and so that the Board may have the opportunity to hear the comments of the public. Executive sessions of the Board are not open to the public.

A period of three minutes per speaker for public comment shall be provided at all meetings.
