- Of the 32 sections of classes of math, literacy, science, and social studies, 11 sections **(34%)** of them are **above** the recommended class size guidelines.

Grade 6

- Of the 42 sections of classes of math, literacy, science, and social studies, 2 sections **(5%)** of them are **above** the recommended class size guidelines.

Grade 7

- Of the 54 sections of classes of math, literacy, science, social studies and World Language, 18 sections **(33%)** of them are **above** the recommended class size guidelines.

Grade 8

- Of the 55 sections of classes of math, literacy, science, social studies and World Language, 39 sections **(71%)** of them are **above** the recommended class size guidelines.

- Of the 20 sections in grades 7-8, 12 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. **(60%)**

Art Classes

- Of the 40 sections, 13 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. **(33%)**

Technology Education Classes

- Of the 40 sections, 14 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. **(35%)**

- Of the 40 sections, 10 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. **(25%)**

World Language 5th & 6th

- Of the 20 sections, 0 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. **(0%)**

Chorus

- 5th Grade Chorus includes 42 students
- 6th Grade Chorus includes 41 students
- 7th Grade Chorus includes 27 students
- 8th Grade Chorus includes 42 students

Band

- 5th Grade Band includes 68 students
- 6th Grade Band includes 53 students
- 7th Grade Band includes 36 students
- 8th Grade Band includes 38 students

Physical Education Classes

- Of the 120 sections, 42 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. **(35%)**

Health Classes

- Of the 80 sections, there are 32 sections are **above** the class size guidelines. (40%)

*****There are 3 Physical Education teachers - because students take 3 rotations of PE a year.

There are 3 Music teachers - The band/chorus teachers split the rotations depending on the grade level because they have individual and group lessons. There are 2 Health teachers - because students take 2 rotations of Health a year.

Science Classes: 61 sections, 23 sections (38%) are above the guidelines of 21 with the largest class at 27 students.

World Language Classes: 37 sections, 15 sections (40%) are above the guidelines of 21 with the largest class at 30 students.

World Language enrollments: Spanish – 553 French – 38 American Sign Language - 68

Career and Technical Classes: 21 sections, 6 sections (29%) are above the guidelines of 19 with the largest class at 26 students.

Business Classes: 18 sections, 18 sections (100%) over the guidelines of 19 with the largest class at 30 students.

Art Classes: 21 sections, 5 sections (24%) are above the guidelines of 19 with the largest class at 25 students.

Music Classes: 21 sections, 12 sections (57%) are above the guidelines of 19 with the largest class at 63 students.

Health Classes: 20 sections, 9 sections (45%) are above the guidelines of 23 with the largest class at 28 students.

PE Classes: 25 sections, 9 sections (36%) are above the guidelines of 23 with the largest class at 28 students.
